FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT / PRIMER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

FROM THE PASTOR

Prisoners

In the second reading for this First Sunday of Lent, St. Paul writes about Jesus preaching "the spirits in prison."

"How are we spirits in prison? It seems to me that in the year 2024, there are two prisons in which most people find themselves. One is ancient. One is modern.

Our modern prison is the cell phone. How many of us can dare to be separated from it for one day? How many of us will even turn it off while we are in the Church? Ask yourself: How many times per day do I pray? How many times per day do I look at my cell phone? Both Android and Apple phones will show you how much time you spend each day looking at the phone. I would encourage you to look at time amount of time you are spending each day with the phone and see if perhaps you can reduce the amount of time during the Season of Lent.

O ancient prison is the prison of culture. Each of us is born and raised as part of a particular culture. Our ways of thinking and acting are shaped by our culture. So much so that we often cannot identify what is common to all people and what is part of our particular culture.

Jesus in the gospels did not hesitate to critique the culture. He criticized the culture of the pagans. He criticized the culture of his own people. The Kingdom of God is not a part of any particular culture, it is above all earthly cultures.

In this season of Lent we are called to metanoia, a new way of thinking, a new way of being.

Is it ok to be proud of our culture? Absolutely. But we must also not be afraid to rise above our culture. We must rise above our culture when it separates us from others. We must rise above our culture when the values of the culture are not the same as the values of the gospel. We must not be afraid to examine and critique our culture.

Jesus came to set us free. As we are told in the Gospel of John "to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God."

In this season can we all pray for Christ to set each of us free from whatever imprisons us and keeps us from living each day as true children of God and members of his one family, the Church.

MENSAJE DEL PÁRROCO

Prisioneros

En la segunda lectura de este Primer Domingo de Cuaresma, San Pablo escribe sobre Jesús predicando "a los espíritus encarcelados".

¿Cómo somos los espíritus en la cárcel? Me parece que en el año 2024 hay dos prisiones en las que se encuentra la mayoría de las personas. Uno es antiguo. Uno es moderno.

Nuestra cárcel moderna es el teléfono celular. ¿Cuántos de nosotros podemos atrevernos a separarnos de ella por un día? ¿Cuántos de nosotros lo apagaremos mientras estemos en la Iglesia? Pregúntate: ¿Cuántas veces al día rezo? ¿Cuántas veces al día miro mi celular? Tanto los teléfonos Android como los de Apple te mostrarán cuánto tiempo pasas cada día mirando el teléfono. Te animo a que mires la cantidad de tiempo que pasas cada día con el teléfono y veas si tal vez puedes reducir la cantidad de tiempo durante la Temporada de Cuaresma.

¡Oh antigua cárcel es la prisión de la cultura! Cada uno de nosotros nace y crece como parte de una cultura particular. Nuestras formas de pensar y actuar están moldeadas por nuestra cultura. Tanto es así que muchas veces no podemos identificar lo que es común a todas las personas y lo que forma parte de nuestra cultura particular.

Jesús en los evangelios no dudó en criticar la cultura. Criticó la cultura de los paganos. Criticó la cultura de su propio pueblo. El Reino de Dios no forma parte de ninguna cultura en particular, es sobre todo de las culturas terrenales. En este tiempo de Cuaresma estamos llamados a la metanoia, a una nueva forma de pensar, a una nueva forma de ser.

¿Está bien estar orgulloso de nuestra cultura? Absolutamente. Pero tampoco debemos tener miedo de elevarnos por encima de nuestra cultura. Debemos elevarnos por encima de nuestra cultura cuando nos separa de los demás. Debemos elevarnos por encima de nuestra cultura cuando los valores de la cultura no son los mismos que los valores del evangelio. No debemos tener miedo de examinar y criticar nuestra cultura.

Jesús vino a liberarnos. Como se nos dice en el Evangelio de Juan, "a los que lo aceptaron, les dio potestad de llegar a ser hijos de Dios".

En este tiempo de Cuaresma, todos debemos orar para que Cristo nos libere a cada uno de nosotros de todo lo que nos aprisiona y nos impide vivir cada día como verdaderos hijos de Dios y miembros de su única familia, la Iglesia.

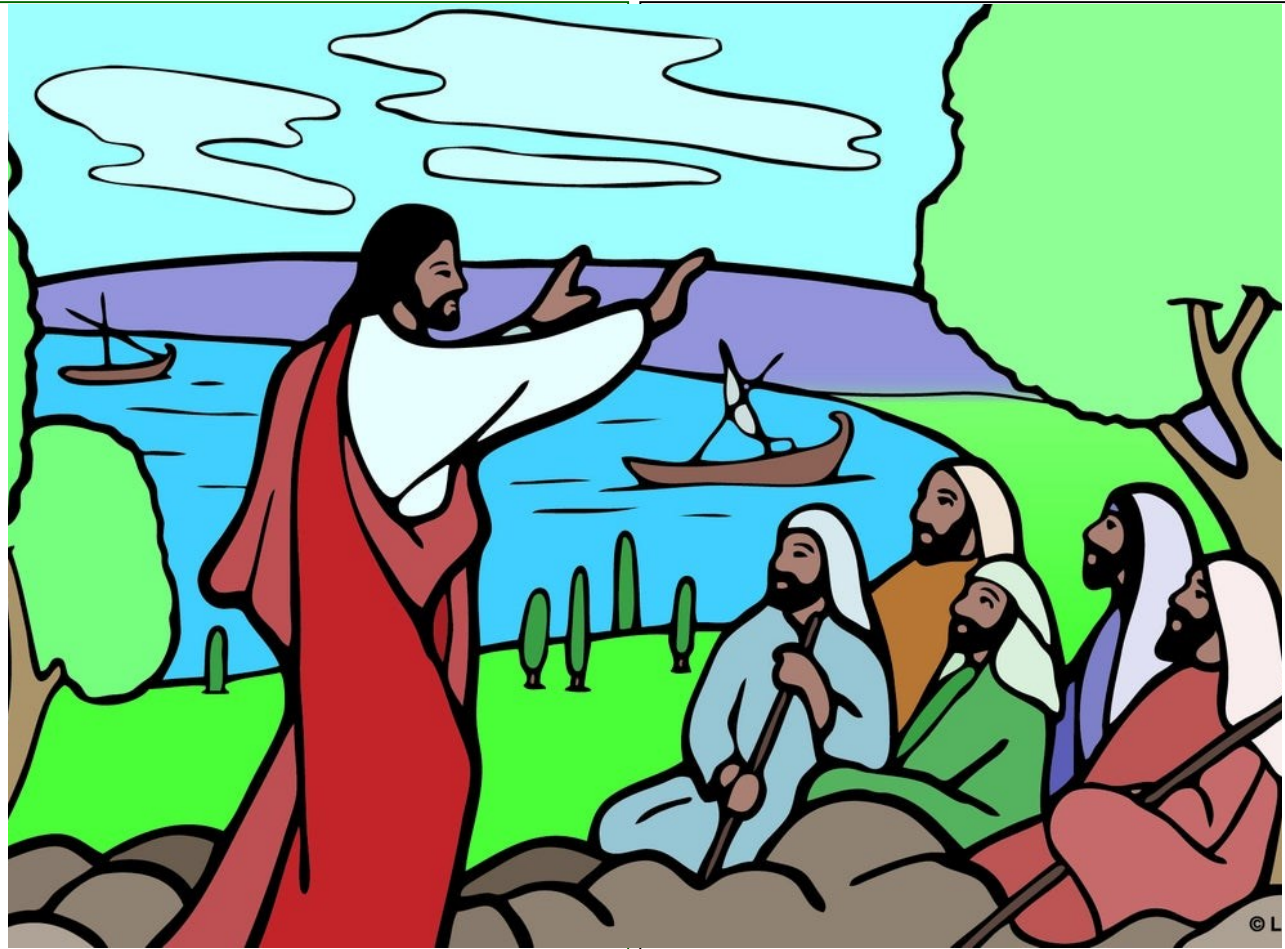

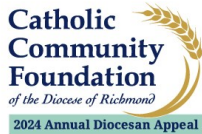

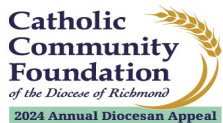
